Subject: RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS

RECOMMENDATION:

The California Department of Transportation recommends the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve the relinquishment resolutions, summarized below, that will transfer highway facilities no longer needed for the State Highway System to the local agency identified in the summary.

ISSUE:

It has been determined that each facility in the specific relinquishment resolutions summarized below is not essential to the proper functioning of the State Highway System and may be disposed of by relinquishment. Upon the recording of the approved relinquishment resolutions in the county where the facilities are located, all rights, title and interest of the State in and to the facilities to be relinquished will be transferred to the local agencies identified in the summary. The facilities are safe and drivable. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the Commission meeting pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

RESOLUTIONS:

Resolution R-3901 – 03-Pla-65-PM 12.1/15.0
(Request No. 036240-X) – 2 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Lincoln on Route 65 (Lincoln Boulevard) between realigned Route 65 (Lincoln Bypass) and the northerly city limits, consisting of superseded highway right of way. The City, by cooperative agreement dated February 14, 2008, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution R-3902 – 03-Pla-65-PM 15.0/22.4
(Request No. 036311-X) – 10 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the county of Placer on Route 65 (Lincoln Boulevard) between the northerly city limits and realigned Route 65 (Lincoln Bypass) consisting of superseded highway right of way, and along realigned Route 65 (Lincoln Bypass), consisting of collateral facilities. The County, by cooperative agreement dated February 19, 2008 and by letter dated October 8, 2013, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution R-3903 – 04-Ala-880-PM R32.1/R34.5
(Request No. 56040) – 7 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Oakland along Route 880 from Market Street to West Grand Avenue, consisting of collateral facilities. The City, by freeway agreement dated July 27, 1993 agreed to accept title and by letter dated March 7, 2014, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution R-3904 – 04-Ala-880S-PM 0.5
(Request No. 56116) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Oakland along Route 880S on Maritime Street, consisting of collateral facilities. The City, by letter dated February 11, 2014, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution R-3905 – 06-Tul-63-PM 3.01
(Request No. 86705) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the county of Tulare along Route 63 on Avenue 256 (Oakdale Avenue), consisting of a reconstructed county road. The County, by relinquishment agreement dated May 14, 2012, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.
