Subject: **FINANCIAL ALLOCATION FOR LOCALLY ADMINISTERED STIP PROJECTS
OFF THE STATE HIGHWAY SYSTEM
RESOLUTION FP-13-66**

RECOMMENDATION:

The California Department of Transportation recommends the California Transportation Commission allocate \$18,025,000 for 32 locally administered State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) projects off the State Highway System, as follows:

- o \$16,768,000 for 28 STIP projects; and
- o \$1,257,000 for four STIP Programming, Planning, and Monitoring projects.

ISSUE:

The attached vote list describes 32 locally administered STIP projects off the State Highway System totaling \$18,025,000, plus \$2,413,750 from other sources. The local agencies are ready to proceed with these projects and are requesting an allocation at this time.

FINANCIAL RESOLUTION:

Resolved, that \$18,025,000 be allocated from the Budget Acts of 2012 and 2013, Budget Act Items 2660-101-0042 and 2660-101-0890 for 32 locally administered STIP projects described on the attached vote list.
