Formulaic Program Share Distribution

On October 18, 2017 the Commission adopted the 2018 Local Partnership Program Guidelines in response to the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017, Senate Bill (SB) 1 (Beall, Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017), as amended by Assembly Bill (AB) 115 (Ting, Chapter 20, Statutes of 2017) and AB 135 (Committee on Budget, Chapter 255, Statutes of 2017). The overall objective of the Local Partnership Program is to reward counties, cities, and regional transportation agencies in which voters have approved fees or taxes solely dedicated to transportation improvements or that have enacted fees solely dedicated to transportation. Pursuant to the guidelines, the Commission will adopt a Formulaic Program of projects for the initial cycle that will cover 2017-18 and 2018-19 for jurisdictions with voter approved taxes, tolls, and fees that are dedicated solely to transportation purposes.

To verify eligibility for the Formulaic Program share distribution, interested jurisdictions were requested to submit the following information by October 27, 2017:

- Ballot information.
- A copy of the ordinance or resolution seeking voter approval of the tax, toll, or fee.
- Election results (Official Statement of Votes Cast).
- For tolls, fees, and taxes other than sales taxes, a copy of the relevant section of the jurisdiction's most recent audited financial statements indicating the revenue generated by the tax, toll, or fee, including posting location on the internet and information about how the revenues are reported to the state.

Once submitted to the Commission, the information was reviewed by Commission staff for compliance with program guidelines. Please refer to the attached table, Eligible Submittals and Proposed Formulaic Share, which outlines the proposed funding distribution for jurisdictions determined by staff to be eligible under the Formulaic Program. This list is compiled accordingly:

- Total amount available for the Formulaic Program and Competitive Programs.
- Proposed distribution of shares for voter-approved taxes, tolls or fees, excluding sales taxes, for cities and counties.
- Proposed distribution of shares for voter-approved taxes for cities and counties in Northern California.
- Proposed distribution of shares for voter approved taxes for cities and counties in Southern California.

This information is provided for purposes of ensuring sufficient time for review by affected jurisdictions prior to the Commission's December 6-7, 2017 meeting at which time the Commission is expected to approve distribution of funds for the formulaic portion of the Local Partnership Program. Notification has also been provided to jurisdictions with ineligible submittals.
