Adoption of Traffic Light Synchronization Program (TLSP) Guidelines

RESOLUTION TLSP-G-0708-001

- 1.1 WHEREAS the Highway Safety, Traffic Reduction, Air Quality, and Port Security Bond Act of 2006 was approved by voters as Proposition 1B on November 7, 2006, included \$250 million for the Traffic Light Synchronization Program (TLSP) to fund traffic light synchronization projects and other technology-based improvements to improve safety, operations and the effective capacity of local streets and roads, and
- 1.2 WHEREAS the Bond Act provided that TLSP funds be deposited in the Highway Safety, Rehabilitation, and Preservation Account and are available, upon appropriation by the Legislature, to the Department of Transportation (Department), as allocated by the California Transportation Commission (Commission), and
- 1.3 WHEREAS the TLSP program is subject to the provisions of Government Code Section 8879.23(k)(2), as added by Proposition 1B, and to Section 8879.50, as enacted through implementing legislation in 2007 (SB 88) designating the Commission the administrative agency responsible for programming TLSP and the agency authorized to adopt guidelines for the program, and
- 1.4 WHEREAS proposed draft TLSP guidelines, prepared by Commission and Department staff, were made available to regional agencies, and the Commission heard comment on that draft at its December 12-13, 2007 meeting, and
- 1.5 WHEREAS Commission and Department staff revised the draft TLSP guidelines, in response to comments received at the December 12, 2007 and the January 10, 2008 Commission meetings and subsequently,
- 2.1 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Commission adopts the attached TLSP program guidelines as amended on January 30, 2008, and
- 2.2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these guidelines are to identify the Commission's policy and expectations for the TLSP program and thus to provide guidance to the Department, regional agencies and project applicants and proponents in carrying out their responsibilities under this program, and
- 2.3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these guidelines do not preclude any project nomination or any project selection that is consistent with the Bond Act, and
- 2.4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commission directs staff to post these guidelines on the Commission's website and requests that the Department assist Commission staff in making copies available to regional agencies and project applicants and proponents.
